

# **FA27. Praying for Our Brother & Our Neighbor.**

*We are to pray for our brother and our neighbor.*

## **Supportive Tanakh Scriptures**

### 1 Samuel 12:23

*Sh'mu'el answered the people, "Don't be afraid. You have indeed done all this evil; yet now, just don't turn away from following ADONAI; but serve ADONAI with all your heart. As for me, far*

*be it from me to sin against ADONAI by ceasing to pray for you! Rather, I will continue instructing you in the good and right way.*

**Job 42:10**

When Iyov prayed for his friends, ADONAI restored his fortunes; ADONAI gave Iyov twice as much as he had had before.

**Comment**

This *Mitzvah* and the others referenced above are what is known as “intercession.” What they have in common is praying for others rather than for ourselves. There are similarities and apparent repetitions among them, but they are individually listed because the verses that support each of them are worded somewhat differently.
