

FA28. Worshiping Yeshua as Adonai

We are to worship Yeshua as Adonai.

This precept is derived from His Word (blessed is He):

Philippians 2:9-11

Therefore God raised him to the highest place and gave him the name above every name; that in honor of the name given Yeshua, every knee will bow- in heaven, on earth and under the earth- and every tongue will acknowledge that Yeshua the Messiah is ADONAI- to the glory of God the Father.

Comment

Worship in the Bible is described as bowing down, kneeling or lying face down in total surrender and obedience before a superior entity. It is a complete giving of oneself to such an entity which is why we are commanded to worship the one true God and no other. Yeshua was worshiped from the time of his birth and all during his lifetime on earth by those who knew and understood

his identity as *Adonai* and Messiah. How much more is he worthy to be worshiped now that he has returned to Heaven and is seated at the right hand of his Father.

Although Yeshua is not named in the *Tanakh*, He is revealed as creator of the world in John 1:1-10, and we are commanded in Psalms 95:6 to worship “*Adonai* who made us.”
